<p>Sing 'Incy, Wincy Spider' and encourage your child to join in with the actions.</p> 	<p>Go for a walk in the garden or park. Look under stones, leaves and sticks to see if you can find some minibeast. Take photos of anything you find.</p> 	<p>Make a model minibeast using playdough. Show your child how to roll the dough to make a wiggly worm.</p> 
<p>Sing 'Old McDonald Had a Farm'. Encourage your child to choose which animal to sing about next and see if they can make the noises.</p> 	<p>Use picture cards and encourage your child to point to the animals when asked. Make the animal noises and encourage your child to copy.</p> 	<p>Talk about your pet or what pet they would like. Ask your child to help look after your pet-fill the bowl with food/ water or go on a visit to a pet shop and look at what pets like to eat.</p> 
<p>Provide some cut potatoes, wooden blocks or sponges to dip into paint and onto paper to create animal pictures. They could also explore creating footprints of different pets.</p> 	<p>Watch the story of 'Dear Zoo' on You Tube Kids. Encourage your child to name the animals and join in with the repeated phrases.</p> 	<p>Create an edible sensory farm activity for children to explore using cereals, chocolate mousse and water. Add some small farm animals and encourage your child to make the animal noises or say the names.</p>
