Evaluation

Pupils are more engaged in a range of physical activities during outdoor learning sessions, leading to greater levels of physical activity. We have continued to benefit from the range of in-house expertise in delivering specialist PD and therapy sessions to pupils in order to maximise their progress.

The school has achieved the Gold Sports Awards this year as a result of the commitment and dedication of staff to raise the standards in PE across the school. Investing in the purchase of equipment that support the physical well-being and sensory needs of the pupils has also had an impact on the profile of the importance of physical activity in school.

Pupils were able to take part in a range of new activities as part of Healthy Living Week and demonstrated a range of skills, such as determination, perseverance and attempting something new.

We have continued to support the early water confidence skills of all our pupils, ensuring an appropriate range of equipment is available to support their learning.

Pupils have attended a number of competitions over the course of the year and the PE lead has been proactive in looking for opportunities throughout the year. In addition, we have utilised resources and training in-house to increase participation in inter-house competitive sports and activities.

Y6 Swimming Summary

As a specialist setting, we use the Halliwick Programme to demonstrate progress in early swimming skills, water confidence and water safety. Movement and therapy exercises in the water also form part of the holistic curriculum offer for pupils with complex needs.

The majority of pupils in Year 6 access weekly swimming lessons at the local, public pool.
