Free School Meals

- If your child is eligible for free school meals, they may also be entitled to additional funds, paid to school, to boost their learning.
- Children qualify for free school meals if you receive benefits.
- Pupils can also bring their own packed lunch.

Community Playground Pass

- Once you have registered on Weduc and you have activated your account, you will be able to apply for a Springwood Community Playground pass. This involves filling in a short form, we will process the information and send a pass home with your child.
- The community playground is at the Swinton site. It can be accessed after the school day, at weekends and during school holidays. The pass activates both the pedestrian gate and large gate so you have access to the carpark.
- The playground gate has a carabiner on it. Please make sure that this is back on when you have finished your time on the playground.
- The pass will also let you gain access to the community bathrooms.

Parental Engagement

- Parents play a very important part in their child's education. Good communication links between home and school will benefit your child and help their learning and development.

In addition to our communication via Weduc, at Springwood we have:

- Parents' Day/Evening in the Autumn and Summer Term
- Annual review of EHC Plan
- Termly Parent's Weeks where you will be invited into school
- Weekly photographs via Weduc

Where necessary, we can hold two meetings so that both parents can attend separately.

Family Liaison Officers

- Our Family Liaison Officers, Rachael and Faye, are available to speak to you should you have any questions or concerns while your child is at Springwood. Both FLOs support families work across all of our sites.
